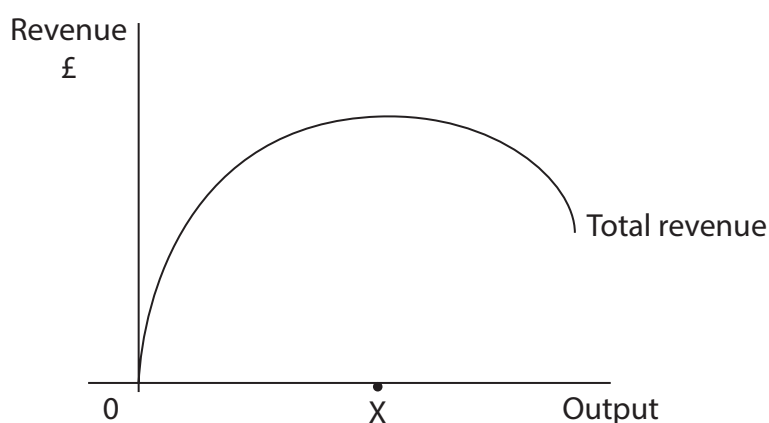

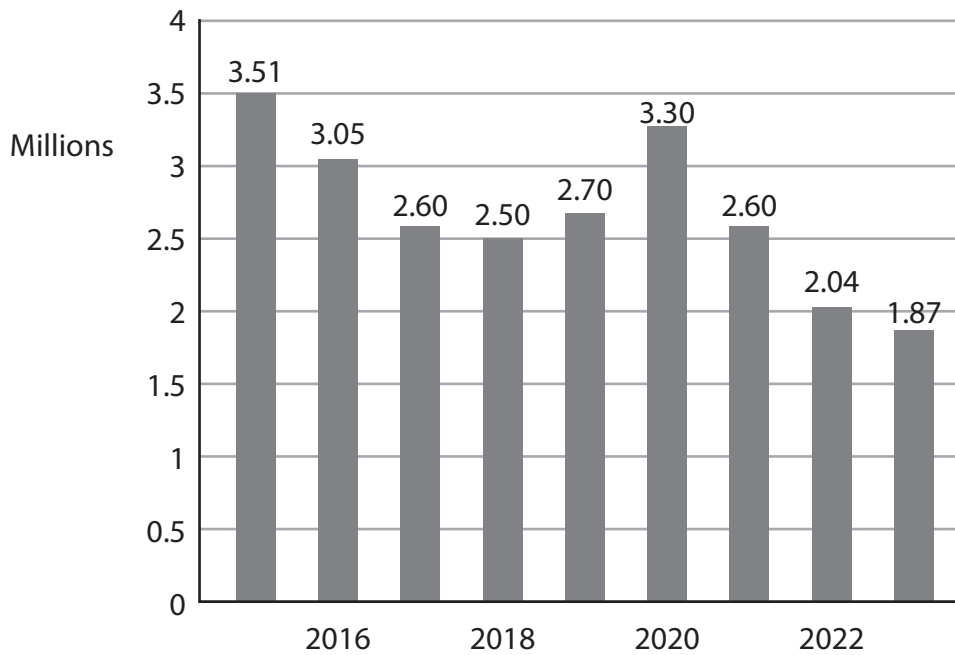
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The UK bicycle industry**Figure 1 Number of bicycles sold in the UK, millions, 2015–2023****Extract A The UK bicycle market**

The UK bicycle market is facing a challenging period with declining sales. In 2023, sales were at their lowest in over 10 years. Since 2020, this decline was mainly caused by:

- a decrease in consumer demand after the boom in bicycle sales during the global health crisis
- high inflation rates.

However, in 2023, sales of some types of bicycles increased. For example, electric bikes (e-bikes) are becoming a more popular choice. Mintel, a market research business, forecast a 12% increase in bicycle sales in 2024. This increase in demand is expected to be caused by a combination of factors, including a recovery in consumer spending and significant price reductions by retailers.

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Extract B Competition in the UK bicycle market

There were 2 234 bicycle retailers in the UK in 2023. This was a decrease of 2.1% compared with 2022. The majority of these retailers are independently owned. However, a few large businesses dominate the market, including Evans Cycles, Chain Reaction Cycles, Wiggle and Halfords.

A rise in online shopping has been a challenge for many small-scale bicycle retailers. Online sales initially provided an opportunity for small-scale businesses to increase their market shares. However, the larger businesses quickly dominated the online market by investing heavily in advertising and branding, and by offering online discounts. These strategies have resulted in a reduction in contestability.

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In 2023, an increasing number of bicycle retailers shut down. As the global health crisis eased, people started returning to their old routines and the demand for bicycles decreased. This left retailers with many unsold bicycles. To sell the excess supply, the large businesses reduced their prices. As a result, many small-scale retailers could not compete with these lower prices.

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However, there are still opportunities for small-scale bicycle retailers to succeed. These businesses offer unique expertise and specialist services such as bike fitting and selling a niche range of bicycles. Some of these businesses have also been successful in adapting quickly to the growing demand for e-bikes.

Extract C Halfords

Halfords is the largest bicycle retailer in the UK, with a market share of approximately 20%. It has been successfully selling new and innovative products, such as electric scooters (e-scooters). Halfords is also a market leader for e-bikes.

In the first quarter of 2024, Halfords' profit before tax fell by 18% compared with the previous year. Revenue fell because poor weather caused a decrease in sales of bicycle products. Total costs had also increased by 12.7%. This was mainly caused by:

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- a 10% increase in the national minimum wage
- significant increases in transport costs.

Halfords aims to overcome these challenges and continue to grow its business by:

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- focusing on its services business e.g. bike servicing, which is less affected by economic downturns
- investing in its online presence to reach more consumers
- increasing its price competitiveness
- expanding its sales of e-bikes and e-scooters.
