Extract A

Jack Levine Accountants (Levine)

Levine is an accountancy business located in the state of Florida in the US. Established in 1984, it has grown into one of the most respected businesses in the area. This is important because there are over 18,500 qualified accountants in the state of Florida. Legislation prevents large accountancy businesses from merging, to maintain a high level of competition. 5

The accountants at *Levine* offer a high-quality service that helps customers with their finance and taxation. They aim to save customers time and money, as well as to ensure that all work dealing with sensitive financial information is kept secure.

Customers are allowed up to 90 days to pay after completion of the work provided by the business. This has helped *Levine* increase its customer base by taking market share from competitors. However, it is likely to affect cash flow. 10

Reviews of *Levine's* service often state that its accountants appear to be happy in their work and are focused on doing their best to help the customers.

smol

smol is a UK-based private limited company (ltd) that produces and sells laundry, washing and cleaning products. It was started in 2018 by Paula Quazi and Nick Green, former employees of a multinational public limited company (plc), *Unilever*, which is now one of *smol*'s main competitors.

smol uses lean production to achieve efficiency. It sells quality products which are environmentally-friendly and its packaging is made from sustainable material. The products are conveniently delivered to the customer's home at a competitive price. Customers typically set up a subscription for repeat purchases of *smol* products, which are only available via the *smol* website.

Customers can try *smol*'s products by requesting a free 'starter pack' but they pay a small charge to cover postage. The starter pack contains a reusable bottle for liquids, such as for cleaning spray, washing-up liquid or fabric conditioner. The bottles are made using 100% recycled plastic and can easily be refilled.

Extract E

Learn to drive

In 2022, Khalil started his own driving school in Tunis, Tunisia. He has created a good reputation for offering a friendly, competitive service and his driving school achieves a high pass rate for his learner drivers.

Khalil charges 40 Tunisian dinar (TND) for each one-hour lesson. Many of his customers are students at the nearby Carthage University. 5

Before starting his driving school, Khalil worked as a taxi driver, often working through the night. He decided to change occupations after the birth of his twins, to spend more time at home helping his wife, Yasmine, with their family. Yasmine manages the finances of the driving school as well as booking lessons for the customers. 10

Khalil wants to increase the number of customers taking lessons with his driving school and is considering several options. One option is to offer discounts to customers who refer a friend for lessons and to those who prepay for 10 lessons. Other options are to pay for advertising or to expand his service area outside Tunis.
